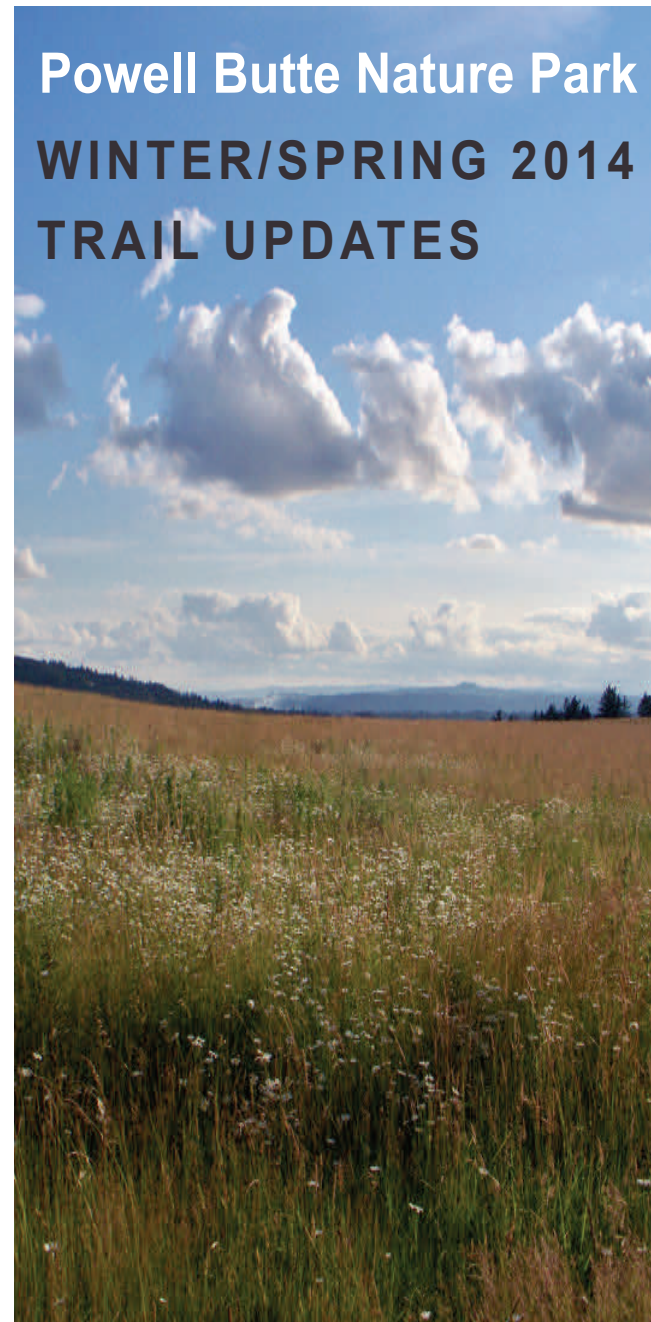

WINTER/SPRING 2014 TRAIL UPDATES

The Portland Water Bureau is in the process of building a second underground 50-million gallon reservoir at Powell Butte Nature Park. The Portland Water Bureau and Portland Parks & Recreation are committed to keeping the nature park and its uses (hiking, bicycling, equestrian use, bird watching, etc.) open to the public and as normal as possible while the work proceeds.

THE POWELL BUTTE NATURE PARK provides nearly 10 miles of trails that offer hiking, biking and equestrian opportunities. As construction of the new reservoir and park facilities proceeds, trails in the park will be detoured and temporarily closed for improvements. Park users are reminded to keep out of fenced construction areas and to stay on open designated park trails.

As part of the improvement projects at Powell Butte Nature Park, the Portland Water Bureau and Portland Parks & Recreation worked with park users to develop a new trail plan that included renaming several trails.

The new trail names will go into effect in late 2014. Both the new and old trail names are included on the *Temporary Trail Map with New Trail Names* shown to the right.

Note that trails may have periodic closures for construction during 2014.
